





- ✓ Spanish side led by a company Collaboration with other Spanish R&D entities (research institutes, universities, technology centres, hospitals, etc.) is permitted and it can be funded
- ✓ Indian side led by R&D entity headquartered in India. Exception! Bilateral program with DST → Indian side led by Indian company
- ✓ The Indian partner and the Spanish partner must be independent (no affiliated companies)



 No public agency will fund the Indian participant
- Special considerations
 - No restrictions in terms of Indian partners
 any R&D Indian entity, including companies
 India partner must self-fund their participation
 - No restrictions in topics or sectors

 submit project proposal for any sector
 - No calls submit your proposal anytime to CDTI
 - The Indian partner and the Spanish partner must be **independent** (no affiliated companies)

Creation or significant improvement of a product or service or production process

Innovation Project

- Close to market commercialization
- Medium/low technological risk
- Short payback periods

FUNDING PROVIDED BY CDTI

	R&D Projects	Innovation Projects
Grant	Up to 33%	Up to 2-3%
Repayment period	10-15 years	3-5 years
Grace period	1-3 years	1 year
Fixed interest rate	12 month EURIBOR rate	12 month EURIBOR rate + 0,2% (if repayment in 3 years) + 1,2% (if repayment in 5 years)
Minimum budget	€175,000	
Maximum credit	Up to 85% of the budget; 15% from other sources	
Financial advance	 up to 35% of the credit (limit €250,000) without bank guarantees up to 50-75% if bank guarantees are provided 	

Innovation Projects are subjected to the EU De minimis rule - refers to small amounts of State aid companies that do not have to be notified to the European Commission by the EU Member States. The maximum amount is € 200,000 for each undertaking over a 3-year period.

- Amortisation of assets
 - Outsourcing of technical collaborations with other R&D entities from Spain
 - ndirect costs: legal advice for patents protection or IPR, consultancy services, etc.
